

1643. Philimon Wale bought of Edmund Wale myne Arre of upland the land be
~~the same more or less lying in the South part of the town of~~
 of Sudbury, between the land of John Lane on the South side of it, joynted to
 a Spring running from his now dwelling house to the River on the North side
 of it.

Also Philimon Wale bought of John Lane parson Arre of upland the
 the land before expressed of his between the land of the said Philimon
 above mentioned of the land of John Lane.

Also granted to Philimon Wale ten Arre of meadows whereof five
 Arre of it is layd out to Edward Wale of Sudbury on the West side
 of the River four Arre west from the Church and between the upland and
 the River the other five Arre is layd out to John Moore of Sudbury in
 the four Arre end of a piece of upland meadows on the West side of
 the River of Sudbury between the lower side of the great Mill of the upland
 part gate that leadeth to the meadows of William Waleton.

1648. Also granted and layd out unto Philimon Wale in the year 1648
 one hundred and thirty Arre of upland and meadows in the two miles of land
 left granted the town of Sudbury the said one hundred and thirty Arre
 of upland and meadows be it more or less is the right of him and his
 in the second square of land being bounded on the South by the land
 of Edward Wale and also bounded on the North by the land of the said
 Wale also bounded at the West end by the middle high way and the
 square and bounded on the East end by the high way and the five
 miles of land first granted the town of Sudbury.

Joseph Hayward hath bought of Philimon Wale of Sudbury
 eight Arre of meadows be the same more or less lying in the
 Culph. having the meadow of the house of Robert Dauler northwardly and
 meadow of John Wale and Stephen Wale southwardly and upon all other parts
 the common Land of Sudbury.
