Granted to Thomas Plimpton ten acres of upland lying on the west side of the River at Strawberry bank, joining to the land of John Col. the land of John Blanford.

Thomas Plimpton bought of William Harley three acres of upland lying on the west side of the River, lying between the land of John Good now of Robert Roast parted from the great River Meadow by the highway.

Also granted and layd out unto Thomas Plimpton in the year 1658. one hundred and thirty acres of land in the two last miles of land granted the town of Sudbury the said one hundred and thirty acres of land being the five and forty lot and lying in the forty and forty west square of lots having the lands of Thomas Goodnow on the north and the lands of John Hains on the south being bounded at the west end by the mill-ways and also bounded at the east end by the middle highway joining to the first square of lots the 2^d of 96 acres.

Granted By the town of Sudbury that Thomas Plimpton should lay down his seven acres and one third part of an acre of land lying on the narrowst side of Goodman's Hill and surrendering the town's hand again and in due time of take up seven acres or the like quantity of land at this great field. now have according to the town's order laid out the same at his said field. about three quarters of a mile from his house where he began our line at the north end of his said field. at a great black oak tree which we marked. standing with in two rods of his house & from thence we ran the line westward to another great oak tree which we marked. from thence the line was ran to a walnut tree which we marked by the side of the hill & from thence we ran the line south only to a white oak tree which was the old marked tree of Stopen or John Blanford's and have marked two walnut trees that stand in the line & from thence that white oak tree we ran the line easterly by Blanford's lands to a great tree marked standing standing by the said Plimpton's old field. that parted between the lands of Blanford and the said Plimpton this parcel or piece of land containing the same quantity as the said Thomas Plimpton did surrender up at Goodman's Hill to the town's witnesses our hands the 2^d of May 1685
