Also Measured unto Robard Man twolue acres of land where
his dwelling house stands: as it is Signified in these plats one part
of it is on the Northerly side of the highway bounded by John
Blauforde's land North and South by the highway Every way
Else by the Common the other part is bounded Northerly by
The aforesaid highway and Every way Else by the Common lands
of this town: Surveyed by John Brigham May 13: 1703
This was Exported by a vote of the proprietors the day and
year a bond written

This about 80 twolue acres of land was granted first to John Coll
and now in the possession of Robard man

We the Subscribers Selectmen of the Town of Sudbury have
agreedable to a partition of Mr. William Heard and Mr. Harry
Howe have laid out a Road through land of Mr. Elisha Hunt
one hundred and thirty nine rods, beginning at Danham Road so
called near said Hunts Running Easterly as the fence now
stands to a stake and stones thence to a oak tree marked thence to a
nother oak tree marked thence to a stake and stones to land of
the said Heard. The said road is to be two rods wide the bounds
all on the Northerly side we also agree with the said Hunt for damages
of the said road Sixty Dollars.
