

Sudbury April the 24: 1722

upon y<sup>e</sup> Request of David Rice and several other Inhabitants  
on y<sup>e</sup> East side of y<sup>e</sup> River in Sudbury Desiring us y<sup>e</sup> select men  
of Sudbury for to lay them a convenient high way to Come into  
Sudbury Town: Accordingly we have laid out a high way the  
Day and year above s<sup>d</sup> as followeth: Beginning att y<sup>e</sup> south line  
of our town between Sudbury and Natick att a brook Called Snake  
Brooke on y<sup>e</sup> south side of John Dunton Jun<sup>r</sup> house: and so from y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup>  
brooke to y<sup>e</sup> west end of y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> John Dunton house and so alonge from  
thence pointing Norwest to an apple tree marked in y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> John  
Duntons Land: y<sup>e</sup> apple tree standing on y<sup>e</sup> East side of s<sup>d</sup> highway  
and so alonge to a Rail fence standing between y<sup>e</sup> land of Thomas  
Dunton and Henry Rice: with several trees marked by y<sup>e</sup> side of  
y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> fence: and so along as y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> fence Runs: Joyning upon y<sup>e</sup> land  
of Samuel Gould: to a white oake and so two Rods on y<sup>e</sup> Land of  
Phillip LeRich<sup>e</sup> <sup>to a stake</sup> thence to a small Red oake marked in David Rices  
Land: and so along from thence trees being marked on y<sup>e</sup> East side  
the high way throu y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> David Rices Land: and so along Throu  
y<sup>e</sup> Land of Phillip LeRich: Trees being marked on y<sup>e</sup> East side  
y<sup>e</sup> high way: and so along throu y<sup>e</sup> Land of Ebenezer Rices Trees  
being marked on y<sup>e</sup> East side y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> high way: and so along  
Crossing throu y<sup>e</sup> west Corner of y<sup>e</sup> Land of John Dunton sen<sup>r</sup>: and so  
a Long thence throu y<sup>e</sup> above s<sup>d</sup> Ebenezer Rices Land till it  
Comes to a white oake plant with a heap of ~~stones~~ stones abouts y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup>  
plant: Trees being marked on y<sup>e</sup> East side y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> high way: and  
so along from y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> white oake plant and heap of stones as y<sup>e</sup> Cart  
path Now goes till it Comes to y<sup>e</sup> old town bounds: The high way is  
laid out two Rods wide from y<sup>e</sup> brook Throu out to y<sup>e</sup> old town  
bounds: also y<sup>e</sup> Day and year above s<sup>d</sup> we y<sup>e</sup> select men laid  
out a high way from Elisha Smiths Land end Rods and on half  
wide as y<sup>e</sup> Cart path Now Goes till it Comes into y<sup>e</sup> high way above s<sup>d</sup>
