petitioned unto by several persons inhabitants of y^e west precinct
of Judbury: Living at a place Called Sanham: to lay them out
a Convenient way to Come to meeting on y^e Saboth Days: said
select men went and viewed and laid out a high way as
followeth: beginning at Joseph Gibbs his Corner and so to Sanham Bridge
as y^e way Now Lyes four Rods wide: bounded Easterly by y^e New
standing fence of y^e huts: Then over west meadow one Rods
wide: Then beginning att y^e Northerly end of y^e Causey that is over said
west meadow at a white oak tree marked: in John Goodnew Ditch
Bank two Rod wide: till it Comes against John Goodnew house
Then turning Norwesterly going tow Rods wide betwixt Land of
John Goodnew and Capt Grintnel till it Comes to y^e Country Road
And then from a smal white oak tree marked on y^e Northerly side
y^e Country Road along over a Dam Called Goodnew Dam: and so on
Notherly on y^e westerly side of pod meadow on y^e Easterly side of Green
till it Comes to y^e Land now in y^e Occupation of Josiah pratt marked
