

Judbury July: 6: 1728: we the select men of Judbury laid out a high way
 of two Rods wide beginning at a stake and heap of stones on the Northwesterly side
 the high way the select men of Judbury: laid out from the New meeting
 house in the westerly precinct in said Judbury: to the House of Jam^l Willis
 in 1724: from said Heap of stones: the high way now runs Northwesterly
 to a marked pine tree from thence running to a Grate Rock: as the path
 now is on the Easterly End of horse meadow: still from said Rock running
 Northwesterly to a marked pine tree standing between the hill and Long
 meadow plains in a Clump of pines in land in the possession of Joseph Hayes
 from said pine running a strait line to the Loge Cabin in the New Grant
 thirty Rods high way: and so over said meadow where the Causey now
 is: all the marks of this High way are on the Easterly side of said path

 Bouttels land into the Road leading a Crose pine plain: and all the way
 from the Country Road at Joseph parmenters Hill two Rods wide till it

 we the subscribers laid out the High way from Concord Road a Crose pine
 plain: to the Country Road by Ensign Livermores: beginning at Ephriam Curtis
 and so the high way is laid out at the west End of Curtis land and so between
 the land of said wth Thomas Taylor: and between the land of James Bouttels
 and between land of said Bouttels and Joseph Rutter and between the land of
 the said Bouttel and J^r John Grant and so on the west side of marked trees
 and so on as the Cart path goes between the land of John adames and between
 the land of Elifha Rice: and so on as the Cart path goes: till it comes into
 the Country Road by Weston bounds: The way is laid out all the way from
 Concord Road four Rods wide excepting at Elifha Rices Dam: and thence
 as the fences now stand in
