

We the subscribers select men of the town of Sudbury upon request and at the Desire of several of the Inhabitants living on the Northly side of the westerly precinct in Sudbury: for a way to the meeting house in said precinct: We conceiving the necessity that a narrow land was a particular and private way for the use of the town. Beginning at a heap of stones near about two Rods by it more or less Southwardly from the Dwelling house of Thomas Smith in Sudbury in the Easterly line of a piece of land so Smith bought of Mr Russel in the Elbow of the Cart path and from thence Southly running mostly as the path now goeth through the Grant land then turning a little more Southly through the Grant land of Benjamin Barron till it comes to the Grant land of Deacon James Hayns then turning something more Easterly through the Deacon Hayns Grant land on the Northly side of Joseph Maynard Hayns: until the way comes to the Easterly 30 Rods high way. Note the way is laid out two Rods wide so far and so on through the 30 Rods way until it comes to the Cart path on the Southly side of Cedar Swamp: and so on as the Cart path goes of the west part over the Cedar Swamp plain until it comes to the Deacon Hayns old Homestead lands then two Rods wide and then through his land two Rods wide: until it comes about five Rods Southly of the Deacons Hayns land to his house then to be three Rods again and so on as the Cart path now goeth over a small brook and so on over pantry bridge plain unto the Pantry bridge and a cross the Pantry meadow where the bridge is two Rods wide: and from thence as the Cart path now goeth three Rods wide until it comes to an Elbow between the land of Daniel Noyes and the Elbow and there about to be four Rods wide at the least and then again three Rods wide as the Cart path goeth over pantry and walnut hill and so on over the pine plain between Uriah Whellers and James Craggs and so on three Rods wide over a hill called pondstone or Strawberry hill as the path now goeth through a small corner of land claimed by John Maynard until it comes to a brook called mine way brook: and there to include both Cart paths going over the brook and all the land between the paths and then on three Rods wide as the Cart path now goeth having the paper fence of Mr Spring on the South side until it comes unto the Cwings Ground and then two Rods wide as the Cart path now goeth until the way comes unto the above the meeting house. Note the marks of the way are all on the westerly and Southwesterly side: until it comes to the above the mine way brook: and further Note that on the Cedar Swamp plain the way westerly bounded by the now standing fence of Jabez Puffer as far as the way goeth by his fence: Excepting just where the Puffers fence Elbows into the land to the Puffers house: and the way is further bounded where it goeth over the pantry and walnut hill westerly by the now standing fence of Daniel Noyes: Josiah Hayns: and Uriah Wheller: all which is humbly submitted unto the town of Sudbury for their Exceptance and Confirmation &c.
