 time since by the select men of D Sudbury: Through his land called
 New Grant land: viz six acres and fifty six Rods of land lysing
 and going in D Sudbury: on the westerly side of D Sudbury River
 and in the Easterly: 30 Rod High way in two parcels as namely
 one acre near too and southerly from a meadow called long meadow
 bounded every way by land belonging to D: 30 Rods way marked
 by trees staks and iron stons: also five acres and fifty six Rods near to
 northerly shore from: bounded westerly by D willis Grant land: and
 otherways bounded by land belonging to D: 30 Rods way: staked
 and marked trees all which is further bounded as may appear
