 and being in the Easterly precinct in Sudbury Beginning at a Great
 Black Oak Tree marked stand in the line between Sudbury
 and Weston Near to and Easterly from Nonfuch Round Hill and
 from thence Nor^{westerly}ly: Running as the Cart path Now is having the
 marks of the way on the North Easterly side until said way comes unto
 a parcel of Land belonging unto the heirs of Jonathan Grant deceased
 and so on Norwesterly through the Grants Land: as the Cart path Now
 is: Having the marks of the way on the Southwesterly side: Then
 turning more Northerly as the Cart path Now is through some Land
 Claimed by John Ross: &c: and so on Northerly: as the path Now is
 over a small Brook Easterly of Robert Cuttings Dam: and so westerly
 bounded at that place: and so on Norwesterly Running as the Cart path
 Now is: Having the marks of the way on the westerly side to the County
 Road: so Called Near to and Southerly from the Dwelling House of
 Nathaniel Hays: Then turning westerly from the ~~County~~ County
 Road until said way comes to or against the Land of Zachariah Heard
 then turning: out of the County Road Norwesterly Between the Lands
 of the Heard: and Lands belonging to the Jonathan Grants heirs: Northerly
 bounded: by the Heards Land: Including the Cart path: until the way
 comes unto a small walnut marked standing in or near the Heards
 stone wall: partly Down a hill: and so on Down the hill by road on
 the Southerly Easterly side of the Heards stone wall: until the way comes

 within said Waits Now standing fence: and from the Brook Southerly
 to come to a shear with out the fence at three Rods: and Northerly to
 come to shear: ~~the~~ without the fence five Rods: and from the Northerly
 Corner of the Waits pasture fence Northerly Running to a small white
 Oak marked on the westerly side of the way: and from thence Northerly
 Running to a stake and stone: and from thence on Norwesterly: Running
 as the way Now made through the Land of Peter Bont: Having the
 marks of the way on the Southwesterly side: until the way comes into
 the Road leading to a place Called farmone: and Near to and
 South Easterly from the Peter Bonts: Now Dwelling House: Note the
