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Confront. to the order & Grants of Selectmen of the Town of Sudbury
Laid out to Mrs Sarah Haynes widow & Relict. of Deaⁿ James Haynes
of Sudbury Deceased. — Ten Acres of upland & half. In two parcels —
and one acre of meadowe on the west side Sudbury River being in
the Land Called y^e 30 Rod way. Laying near y^e Easterly End of her now
Grant. And Bounded as follows: Bounded Easterly by y^e Land of
Benjamin Barron Bounded Northerly by Bull meadow & westerly
by a slip of Land Left four Rods wide for a high way Bounded
Southerly by a Road Leading to Marlborough: all to ninety nine
Rods: of upland laying on y^e South side of the Cedar Swamp Bounded
Bounded Easterly by Land Laid out to Sam^l Robbins Northerly
and westerly by Common Land on the Thirtird Rod High way Southerly
by a High way: all to one acre of meadow in Bull meadow: Bounded
Easterly by Land in the possession of Benjamin Barron & Northerly
and westerly by Land of the Thirty Rod High way Bounded Southwardly
to the Land above said & by marked Trees stakes & Stones as is
signified in the Plans. which Land was allowed three Rods for one
To her her Heirs & assigns for ever for Land that was taken out
of her Grant for a high way. Surveyed by ~~me~~ David Haynes

At a select mens meeting in Sudbury January 14th 1735:
The select men laid out a high way on the west side the River two
Rods wide: begining: before James Browers Dwelling House: Canings
within two Rods of said House: and so turning Northorly in said
James Browers Land: on the west side of a Great Stub: and so on in
Browers Land: having marked trees: on the East side: to Land of Cap^t
David Haynes: and so on through Cap^t Haynes Land: having marked
trees on the East side: and so on through lands of Deacon Haynes James
Brower: And lands of Cap^t David Haynes: Till it comes into Land
Left for a high way by John Rosis meadow: having marked trees
on the East side: and so on by the meadow side in Land Left for a
high way: to the meadow of James Brower Jun^r: said high way is all
the way laid out two Rods wide
