By John. Eccleth. Examined and Replotted 22nd me.

their meeting Sept 21. 1744 and
have done it should Comon.

Concern That the Subscriber has both measured that Part
of y^e wide way Leading from Sudbury to Shaw which
Runs through y^e Lands of Mr Jonathan Smith and find it
Runs in To Smiths Land Eighty & Eight Rods and agreeable
To The Directions of y^e Selectmen of Sudbury laid out
Two Rods for one in y^e wide Hurdy Road wide way adjoining to
The westerly Land of Mr Amos Smith Bounded as followeth
Beginning at follow a small Birch standing on an old ditch
in said Amos Smiths Land & Running East twenty three
Degrees South fourteen Rods on Common Land to a stake
Then Running North twenty three Degrees East Twenty five
Rods on Common Land to a stake in an old Ditch then
Running west Twenty Three Degrees North fourteen Rods on
Land Laid To Mr Amos Smith to the End of an old Ditch in the
Meadow Then on y^e said Amos Smiths Land To the Birch
