 That Part of a two Rods wide way leading from Sudbury to

 To the order of the Select men of Sudbury I have laid out
 The D^r Amos Smith Two Rods for one In of West thirty
 Rods wide way Being four Acres and Twenty four Rods
 Which Lys In two Perches Both adjoining to his one Land
 The first Containing two Acres and Twenty Rods Bound as follows Begins
 at a small white oak tree Being the Corner of his other Land & Running
 East Twenty three Degrees South Six Rods and a half on Common Land
 To a small white oak marked By a Side of a Pond then Running North Easterly
 By a Pond fifteen Rods & one Quarter on Common Land to a small Pine
 marked then Running West twenty three Degrees North Seventeen Rods on Common
 Land To a Stake then Running South twenty three Degrees West Partly on
 Common Land and Partly on his one Land to the Pond first mentioned
 Also laid out the Remainder of said allowance Being upland and Swamp
 Containing one Acre & Sixty four Rods Bound as follows Begins at the
 End of an old Ditch In of meadows Being In of Line between D^r Amos
 Smiths and the thirty Rod wide way and Running East Twenty three
 Degrees South fourteen Rods on Lands laid out to m^r Jonathan Smith
 To a Stake In a ditch then Running Northerly on Common Land
 Twenty Six Rods to a oak tree marked the Ditch Being Partly In
 The Line then Running West twenty three Degrees North four Rods
 on Common Land to the Corner of a Pond then Running twenty five
 Rods on his one Land to the Corner of the Ditch first mentioned
