

Sudbury February 9th 1748

Laid out by the Selectmen of Sudbury the following Highway viz. A highway on y^e West Side Sudbury River at a Place called Haynes Island Beginning at a highway & running Between y^e first & second Division of Land as the Stakes and trees are marked to Concord line at Round River in Sudbury Beginning at a Place near the Brook at y^e North Side of a hill called Castle hill and running on y^e West Side of Id way untill it comes to the way that leads from Daul Moore to Concord & is one Rod wide.

Also a highway from y^e Southerly End of Castle hill Beginning at Concord Road & running through Lands of Lot John Noyes and Dea James Brewer and so to the Land of Daul Moore and so by D moores Land & the Lands of Dea James Brewer till it comes to Concord Road as the Path is now trod Two Rods wide or as the Land is left by the Proprietors the above Highways are laid out where is left by the Proprietors for ways and therefore without any Cost to the Town to Purchase y^e Land

Upon y^e Request of Moses Maynard Benjⁿ Parmenter and Daniel Poor the Selectmen Laid out a Highway as followeth viz Beginning at West Meadows on y^e West Side Sudbury River at a Stake one Rod Westerly from the Line Between the Meadow of Joseph Willis and Moses Maynard and so runs Northerly By an old Ditch twelve Rods to a Stake standing on y^e Ditch then turns Easterly to Land formerly Jonathan Grants to an old Stamp on y^e Easterly Side of Id way and from said Stamp to a White oak tree at y^e South End of a highway leading from y^e Country Road at Sandy Hill to Benjⁿ Parmenters
