

At a Town meeting Leaguely warned: met on the first of march 1756.  
and adjourned to march 4<sup>th</sup>. 5. Said Town voted to Give Grant to Benjamin Ball  
his heirs and assigns for Over a small pease of Land where his Barn stands viz:  
Beginning at the North East Corner of his Barn at a stake and heap of stones and  
Running southerly seven Rods to an other stake and heap of stones and turning and  
Running westerly nine paces to a stake and heap of stones and then turning  
northerly and Running eight Rods to an other stake and heap of stones and then  
turning Easterly seven Rods to the first stake mentioned  
The Town by a vote accepted of the above written and gave Leave it may  
be Recorded. Josiah Richardson Moderator

At a Meeting of the Select Men in Sudbury Jan<sup>y</sup> 14<sup>th</sup> 1760.  
The Select Men then laid out a Road leading from Lincoln  
to Mr Samuel Abbot, as followeth viz: Beginning at a Stake  
and Stones in Lincoln Bounds Near Spruce Swamp (so called)  
Then Running Westerly by Lincoln Line, through Mr Josiah  
Farrars Land & Mr John Bruces Land And part of Mr Pratts  
Farm to a Small White Oak marked, standing in an old ditch  
Between Josiah Farrars Land & Lieut Sam<sup>l</sup> Farrars Land - Then  
Running Southerly through Mr Pratts Land, till it comes to a large  
pine Tree Marked, Near Mr Josiah Farrars House, then to a Small  
Grey Oak marked - Then to Mr Farrars Fence; D<sup>s</sup> Way is one Rod  
and half wide on the Southerly Side of D<sup>s</sup> Bounds - Then  
Running South Easterly by D<sup>s</sup> Farrars Fence till it comes to a Grey  
Oak Tree marked, Standing in the Fence between Mr Farrars  
Land & Mr Sam<sup>l</sup> Abbot Land, then by D<sup>s</sup> Abbot Land & Fence  
till it comes to a Stake & Stones in the Corner of D<sup>s</sup> Abbot's Fence.  
D<sup>s</sup> Way is two Rods wide from D<sup>s</sup> Farrars and on the Easterly  
Side of D<sup>s</sup> Bounds till it comes to the Stake & Stones in D<sup>s</sup> Abbot's  
Fence - Then turning & Running Westerly & Southerly through  
Mr Abbot's Land two Rods wide on the Northwesterly and  
Westerly Side of D<sup>s</sup> Abbot's field Fence As the Fence Now Standeth  
till it comes to D<sup>s</sup> Abbot's Dwelling House and a Road -
