At a Meeting of the Select Men and at the Request of Mr Timothy Carver we the Subscribers have laid out a Way begining at a Stake and Stones at the great County Road leading to Marlboro', thro' Lands Belonging to the Heirs of Cap^t Reynolds Seager, and from said Stake and Stones to a white oak Tree marked from thence to another white oak Tree marked, from thence to another white oak Tree marked, from thence a strait line to the Northeast Corner, of St Apollill Brown's Farm from thence as the fence now stands, till it comes to Hop Brook (so called) from thence as the fence now stands, to a Gate Post marked, being the South East Corner of said Seagers Land, the said way is two Rods wide till it comes to the meadows and one Rod wide across the meadows and the Marks are on the Westerly and Southerly sides of said Way
