att a meeting of the Select Men of the said Town, we the Subscribers have laid out a High Way, Beginning at a Rock at the end of a Road, Laid out by the Select Men over, Castle Hills, near Isaac Woodward, and so over the Brook Northwardly to the Eastwardly side of said Woodward's Spring, and so on to the North East Corner of said Woodward's Garden, as the same now stands, and from thence Northwardly a Strait line to a heap of Stones, near Timothy Sherman's House; one Rod and half from the Corner of Woodward's Orchard Fence, and from thence Northwardly; as the Road was formerly trod, to the Town high way, from Sherman's Bridge, to Abbot's; the width of the Way is one rod and half wide — Agreeable to the Request of

We the Subscribers being appointed to Renew the Bounds between the Towns of Sudbury and Stow, have accordingly met and renewed the Bounds beginning near the River above Jewell's Mill, the Bounds are as follows, wit^h beginning at a Large heap of Stones where an Oak Tree formerly stood, So on to a heap of Stones by a Stump then to a Black Oak Tree near the River thence to an heap of Stones by a White Oak ~~tree~~ Stump at the foot of a Hill in Col. Wood's Land, thence to a white Oak Stump with Stones on it in said Wood's Land, and thence to an heap of Stones near Jonathan Puffers House, thence to a pitch Pine thence to an heap of Stones in Daniel Puffers fence thence to a pitch pine Stump in the side of the Great Swamp with a stake on it to a white pine to an other white pine in the Swamp to a pitch pine on the East Side of the Swamp to a pitch pine to an other pitch pine to a Stake and Stones, thence to a pitch pine and so on to a Dry Pitch Pine to an old Pitch Pine Stump and a small white oak tree Marked, to an other ^{small} white oak tree marked by a pine Stump so on to an heap of Stones in Walkers field, and so on to a pitch Pine Stump to an other pine marked and so on to a Broad oak tree at Framingham Corner.
