full and just sum of Eight pounds of Current money twill
four pound: apiece: which money said Goodenow & Wright
payd to me Caleb Hubbard of Braintree for ye Bell of our
meeting hood: as will appear by record in ye old town
book see folio 18

Bifids 20 Shilling apiece out of each of our families
And ten Shill apiece more woe payd to y^e Executors of y^e R^{oy}al
for ye Redemption of y^e bell out of th^eir hands
marr y^e 20: 1698

December y^e 18: 1700: Taken up by me William Walker
a Strawberry horse Colt coming in one or three
years old

Also at a meeting of the Selectmen March 1702 they
made an act amonge them selves that if any one of them
died not appear when they were lawfully warned they should
pay 12 pence a week except sickness prevented them this was
past into an act by a vote of the Selectmen at y^e John Goulds
place

A Black mare about six years old branded one y^e nere Shoulder
with y^e letter X: and a little one y^e nere ear and a bit out of the fore
part of y^e ear taken up by John Woodward of Sudbury Feb^r
y^e 21: 1707 Entered according to Law

A Bay horse about seventeen years old branded with S upon y^e nere buttock and a
blaze down his face and a little white upon off foot on hind and black mane and
tail taken up by Thomas Brown of Sudbury Jan^r 20th 1708

A browne Steer Coming two year old with a pece cut out of under side
of y^e ear taken up by John Permenter of Sudbury Dec^r 20: 1709
