 the same on y^e Westerly Side of y^e Highway Beginning at a
 Walnut tree marked at y^e County Road and Joining to the Land
 of M^r Sam^l Parri^s and so By y^e Sam^l Parri^s Land (2) to a black
 Oak (3) to a black oak (4) to a Crooked black oak (5) to a
 Black oak (6) to a black oak (7) to a black oak (8) to a
 Oak (9) to a small walnut tree (10) to a walnut tree near
 M^r Parri^s gate (11) to a small walnut tree Standing in y^e
 Parri^s fence and so as the fence standeth to y^e Corner of M^r
 Warts Stone wall and from thence to an Apple tree marked
 and so as M^r Warts fence stands on y^e Westerly Side of y^e
 highway untill it Comy to the Land of Potter Bonts and
 as the fence standeth against y^e Bonts Land untill it Comy to
 the Brook one Rod Below the Bridg Called New Bridg the
 above y^e highway Not to Be less then three Rods wide at
 any Place and in Consideration of the Softness of the Land
 against the Corner of y^e Stone wall Between M^r Joseph Warts
 and M^r Sam^l Parri^s the said highway is not to Be less then
 four Rods wide or as the fence stands on Both Sides of the
 highway
