

Memorandum

The following agreement was made Between the Selectmen of the town of Sudbury on the one Part and m^r Abraham Williams of Marlborough on the other Part the Do m^r Williams agreed on his Part with the Selectmen to keep a Grammar School in the Town of Sudbury also to teach & instruct children and youth in Reading Writing and Sifering for three months from the fourteenth day of August A.D. 1744 on his Part & the Selectmen on their Part engage the town of Sudbury shall pay him for his service the sum of Seventeen Pounds Ten Shilling in Bills of old Tenor or other Bills of Publick Credit Equivalent in Value and if the town to pay for his Board Washing and Lodging and for the True Performance Each Party have here unto set their hand.
