

A Record of the highway on the west side the River to
 The Town of Sudbury bearing date March 25: 1703 to settle the ~~high~~
~~way~~ bounds of the highway: Beginning between the lands of Thomas
 Plymton and ~~rather~~ Plymton and the lands of Thomas Noyes we bearing
 upon the spot and according to our Judgment and Consideration
 found out that which doth clearly Convinced us: that we have found
 found the primitive Line on the North Easterly Side of the highway that
 Joynes to the lands of the afore said Thomas Noyes as it doth appear
 By marked Trees and a stake which are as followeth: beginning at the
 Southwest Corner of Thomas Noyes orchard now in the possession of Peter
 Daynes and soe a straight line to a black oak marked bearing Cut down
 having marked the Stake: and soe running to a black oak marked
 Next running to a white oak near to the Meadow marked Soe running
 over the Meadow to a white oak which was marked So then a
 straight line as near as may be to a Stake standing six fods
 Northwesterly of Thomas Plymtons fence: this way is to be six fods wide
 all through out: May 20: 1703
