y^e day and yeare above written orded that there shall be a new
pound built for the town and y^e pound is to be set where y^e old pound now
stands: the pound is to forty foot square and it be of a sufficient height
for keeping in all sorts of creatures that to be impounded there and that
it be every way Substantiall and strong with a ferent gate which
Sam^l King Esq^r Rec^d by agreement made with y^e town hath now engaged to
performe it every way who hath also engaged himself and his Heires and
assignes in all respects to keep up and maintain y^e said pound there in
Substantiall and sufficient Repaire for y^e term of twenty yeares after
date: and for y^e same y^e said town is to have five pound in money
paid by y^e town in full satisfaction for y^e school
also agreed and voted that y^e five pound is to be granted by y^e town
town next march and voted that there should be a Lock bought for y^e pound
at y^e town charge
and voted that Sam^l King is to be pound keeper to Lock every pound
