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The forth day of December by adjournment of said Town voted that  
the select men of Sudbury should make a rate of 66 pound  
money and commit it to the Constables of Sudbury forth  
with to collect and gather the same & rate being to pay m<sup>r</sup>  
Sharmons arrears said money to be paid at fifteen pence weight  
or proportionable of credit and if same being gathered so to deliver said  
money to y<sup>e</sup> Town Treasurer the Constable or Constables to be allowed  
reasonable satisfaction for gathering of same  
This above written vote past into an act of day and year

at a meeting of y<sup>e</sup> select men a rate of 66 pound was made according  
to y<sup>e</sup> vote of y<sup>e</sup> Town December 4<sup>th</sup> 1706 and delivered so of Constables  
to gather and collect and pay m<sup>r</sup> of Town Treasurer  
Constable and Hayons part to gather is 33 16 and Constable John  
Laker part to gather is 34 08

y<sup>e</sup> Town of Sudbury and m<sup>r</sup> Sharmons attornies one of our select being  
under y<sup>e</sup> power of y<sup>e</sup> execution therefore we desire a full meeting for  
we must act in y<sup>e</sup> concerns with speed as to y<sup>e</sup> obtaining of money  
allready promised and make your return to y<sup>e</sup> select Tho Plympton select  
men of your doings at time and place  
Sudbury December 13 1706 By virtue of y<sup>e</sup> within

At a town meeting lawfully w<sup>re</sup> December 13 1706  
mayer Tho Brown chosen moderator

and there voted that y<sup>e</sup> eighty two pound of money with y<sup>e</sup> cost be paid  
or tendered to be paid unto m<sup>r</sup> Sharmons or his Lawfull attornies on Monday  
next Insuring this date provided y<sup>e</sup> y<sup>e</sup> Town a full discharge from all Rates  
formorty due to y<sup>e</sup> m<sup>r</sup> Sharmons and acquittance upon y<sup>e</sup> execution as it  
being fully satisfied this above written vote was past into an act
