We y^e Select men of Sudbury order you to warn y^e freholders and other Inhabitants of and belonging to y^e Town of Sudbury qualified as y^e Law directs to meet at y^e meeting house on Wednesday y^e 28 at Ten of y^e Clock fore noon of sd day answer m^r Israel Loring's proposals which y^e sd m^r Loring made to y^e Town April y^e eight 1708 and also take care y^t y^e Town be provided with a grammar School master: and y^e Town Treasurer Matthew Stone to give a Count to y^e Town of y^e Towns debts which were in y^e year 1707 and make your return so y^e Select men of your doing herein at time and place according to y^e Contents of this order have warned the Inhabitants of y^e Town

Sudbury April y^e 28 1708: at a Town meeting Legaly warned John Brigham Chosen Moderator y^e day and year above written voted whether y^e Town will give and grant m^r Israel Loring our pastor y^e house and four acres of land that was proposed to be his and heirs for ever y^e day and year above written this above written vote was past into act By a vote on y^e negative John Brigham Moderator

Dec Joseph Woyce y^e day above written was Chosen grammar school master for y^e year ensuing by a full vote of y^e Town John Brigham moderator

At a Town meeting May y^e 14 1708 Legaly warned ^{may} Thome Brown Chosen moderator proceeded to y^e worke of y^e day did those agree and vote that There shall be three pound money Levied upon y^e Inhabitants of and Belonging to y^e Town of Sudbury in order to Repair our meeting house where it wants and be added to y^e Rate y^t is now to be made and to be put into y^e hands of Dec Joseph Woyce and Dec Edmond Rice to see y^e worke Don so far as y^e three pound will goe May^r Thome Brown The day and year above written this vote Moderator pass into a act by y^e Town of Sudbury

Sudbury May y^e 20 1708

At a meeting of y^e assessors a town Rate of twenty five pound fourteen Shillings and a penny was made according to y^e grant of y^e Town to pay y^e Town debts and delivered to y^e Constables to gather and collect 49 Constable John Woyce part was 13 Constable Sam^l Willis part 12
