 meeting House for y^e year ensuing and to see whether y^e Town will
 Incourage y^e killing of Black birds and jays for y^e year ensuing and
 to see whe ther y^e town will agree to have two Schole Houses one
 on each side of y^e River as it was formerly granted and at y^e
 places where it was formerly granted to be or whether y^e town
 will have but one Schole house and that y^e grantell p^{er} as it
 was last granted by y^e town or Els to doo some other way Concerning said
 Schole House or Houses as they shall think best and also to grant money
 to build a Schole House or Houses as y^e town shall think best
