then and there to Chuse a man or men to answer the Presentment at the Next Inferiour
Court - and to so if the towne will provide a Grammar School Master as the Law Directs
and all so to see if the towne will Now Receive ten pounds of there Powder Comittly as
they would by there former Vote and to Act in that any thing further in that affair
as the towne sees Cause by Dismissing of there former Comitty or Chusing another
Comitty and fully impowering them to act in that affair - - - and the Select men has
Received the bridge over Asabath River and to see if the towne will Grant the Remaine
of the mooney for bulding of the said bridge - - - and to see what the towne will Doe for
the releaf of Ruth allen who is in a low condition - -

November: 19: 1716 - - and the ten Pound of mooney is paid and the town Received it
at said meeting the town ordered five pounds to be paid of there powder mooney to
the said John Ruck he giving a Dis Charge to the town of Sudbury. At said meeting
