side of the knoll and so by Timothy Gibsons Land into the thirty Rod high way
and for satisfaction the select men allow Timothy Gibson & Abraham holdman
to take up as much Land in the thirty Rod high way joining all a long to the
Land of their own Land as is taken from them for the above said way
