to add ten pounds the Remaining part of the twenty pounds Granted to m^r Israel
Loring January 20th: 1718 to be add to his Rate that is now become Due
all so to see if the town will chuse another Constable in Sudbury on the East Side
of Sudbury River in the Room of m^r John Loker the town being admitted to
Agree him & chuse another in his Room
Like wise to bring in Debt & Credit at the above said meeting
all so to imply a man to sweep the meeting house & ring the bell & Dig graves
the year in dueing
Nor west Quarter of the town's petition they Desiring the School master some
part of the time with them
Thomas Baglors petition
all so to see if the town will Grant
the owners of the River Meadow Lots to shut up the high way that goes
between the house lots & the Meadow Lots from m^rs Blandfords corner till it
