These are to order you to warn the free houlders and other inhabitants of
and belonging to the town of Sudbury Quallified as the Law Directs to meet at
the Meeting House in Sudbury on Monday the twentieth Day of June Current at one
of the Clock in the after Noon on said Day then & there to Elect and Depute one or
More persons being free houlders & Resident in the same town According to the
Number set and Limited by an act of the General Court ^{to serve for & represent them in a great} or assembly appointed
to be Conuened Held and Kept for His Majesties seruice at the Court house in Boston

Upon Wednesday the thirtieth Day of July Next Ensueing the Date here of — — —
Like wise to let if the town will Raise the Long Casway in said Sudbury from the town
Bridge to the Gravel pit fiftet inches higher than it is all Ready at the highest place
on said Casway - all so to let if the town will Let it out to be Done that it may be Done
in Conueniant time or to Let out said Casway to Every one his proportion or order it to be
Done - and if said town shal Cause to Let out said Casway to a man or men to Raise there to
Raise Money to pay for the same and Order the Assessors to make a Rate of Either part
of the hundred & fifty pounds or all of it that was formerly Granted by said town
All so to let if the town will Raise the Casways from the Gravel pitt as far as Capt
Haynes is Old place proportionably to the afore said Long Casway when mended —

And make Return to the Select Men
at time & place a bove named
