by the Town of Sudbury to provide on qualified by Law
to keep the grammar school for Sudbury and accordingly we
have in the behalf of said Town agreed with Sir Samuel
Jonison with the Consent of his father to keep the grammar
school with reading and writing for the term of one year
next ensuing beginning on ~~Monday~~ Monday next the
thirtieth Day of march Current: for Thirty six pounds
to be paid in good Bills of Credit: Reserving six weeks
for himself in July and beginning of August we allowing
of him eight Days for himself and what time also he
is absent from the school to make up after the time
is expired so which agreement we have hereunto set
our hands the Day above

To the Constable of Sudbury greeting:

Those are to order you to warn the freetholders and
other inhabitants of and belonging to the Town of Sudbury
qualified as the Law directs to meet at the meeting house
for Sudbury on Monday the twentieth Day of march Current
at Twelve of the Clock at Noon on said Day then and there to
do if the Town will petition to the General Court for the
farmers and farms Lands that is bordering upon the Town of
Sudbury and ordered to the town of Sudbury to do duty during the
Court pleasure: that they may be laid to the Town of Sudbury
for ever:

and to do if the Town will employ a man or more to manage
in that affair:

and make Return of your doing
here in to the select men or Town
Clerk at time and place
