26 Day of December: 1721: at Ten of y^e Clock forenoon on said Day.
So y^e if y^e Town will Grant money to support and Carrey on the
preaching of y^e word of god on y^e westerly side of the River in said Sudbury
And where as y^e place for siting a New meeting house on the westerly
precinct in said Sudbury agreed on by the General Courts Committee &c
Doth not accomodate on third part of the inhabitants of said west
precinct and soe that is a very gr^{at} hinderance and impediment to
the west side inhabitants as to their building their meeting house &c
Now with submission to y^e Gr^{at} and General Court these are to s^e if
the Town will shew their willingness and agree to Chuse a Committee to
prefer a petition to y^e General Court that y^e west side inhabitants may
place their meeting house at y^e place they have formerly and lately
agreed on ~~at~~ being on y^e Rocky plain which place was agreed
on by three quarters of y^e inhabitants on the westerly side y^e River
fail not to make Return of your Doing herein to y^e select men or town
Clerk at said time and place
