Directs: to meet at the meeting house in sd precinct: on Monday the
sixteenth Day of September Current: at one of the Clock sd Day: To take
Care that sd town be provided with a Grammar school master as the Law
Directs: also to see whether the town will Grant money to Defend sd poors
Donation Given by Mr. Peter Noyes: or to act any thing that sd town
shall think most proper Concerning sd Donation: And to see if the town
will Chuse a Committee to act in sd town behalf what they shall think
proper to be Don Concerning the ministerial meadows and Land in sd town
and all other lands and meadows belonging to sd town: and to see if the
town will Do any thing to strengthen the town Bridge over the River in sd
town: and to see whether the town will Discontinue the way
Leading from Mr. John Noyes old house to Capt Curtis Draw barns leading
into his field lying southerly of sd Curtis barn: also to see if the town will
Chuse a Committee and Impowre them: or the select men: for to make
satisfaction for to such as have had High ways laid out through their Land
lincing on Lands Called New Grants out of the thirty rod high way: and
make Return of your Doings at heavin at time and place to the select men
