At the afore said Town Meeting May ye<sup>th</sup> 12: 1729

The Town proceeded and Chose Mr. John Haynes Moderator  
Voted at said Town meeting that their Trustees for the Last Sixty thousand  
Pounds pay in to their Town Treasurer the Towns part of the Intrest money  
being £ 10 = 10 = 4: he Giving a Receipt in full there for: and Enter said  
Receipt Upon Record

Voted at said meeting to a Law Cap<sup>t</sup>. Joshua Haynes M<sup>r</sup>. John Rice & En<sup>t</sup>. John Haynes

Their Trustees for the Last Sixty thousand pounds: five and twenty shillings a piece  
and that their Town Treasurer Cap<sup>t</sup>. Ephraim Curtis pay the said sum as aforesaid out  
of the Towns part of the Intrest money in his hand in full for their past service.

Likewise said Town of Sudbury by a Vote Did a Law & Grant. to Cap<sup>t</sup>. Ephraim Curtis  
their Representitive for the year past. the sum of forty nine pounds & four shillings  
in full for his service at the Generall Court. ye<sup>th</sup> year past

Likewise said Town by a Vote Did a Law and Grant to the said Cap<sup>t</sup>. Curtis £ 6 = 15 = 4  
being the Towns part. of the Intrest as aforesaid in part. and so much towards ye<sup>th</sup>  
payment of the aforesaid £ 49 = 4 = 0. and the Remainder being forty two

pounds Eight shillings & Eight pence: Said Town by a Vote ordered their  
Assessors for to make into a Rate with the Towns rated last Granted: ye<sup>th</sup> first  
Day of June next and Commit the same to the Constables of said Town for to  
Gather and Collect. &c

Likewise said Town Voted that if the said Cap<sup>t</sup>. Ephraim Curtis shall or do  
at any time here after Draw or Receive out of the province Treasures

the aforesaid sum of Forty nine pounds & four shillings for his service  
as aforesaid: that then ye<sup>th</sup> said Cap<sup>t</sup>. Curtis. to Repay the same to ye<sup>th</sup> said Town

It was put to vote for to see if said Town would give answer to a petition of  
Jury of the Inhabitiants of said Town. viz. to prefer a petition to ye<sup>th</sup> next  
Sessions of the peace to be holden in and for ye<sup>th</sup> County of Middlesex for the turning of  
the Contrey Road in said Sudbury near to the House of Mr. John Groat to a more convenient  
and suitable place for passing &c And it past in the Negative.
