thing towards the fencing and Clearing the ministerial meadow at long meadow
4 also to receive and Dispose of the towns part of the Interest of the last Bank
and pay their trustees for their last years Service:
5 Likewise to see if the town will make answer all the General Court to a petition
of Timothy Gibson and others living in Sudbury and on the North side of Elbow
River: lodged in the General Court: praying to be taken from Sudbury and

more money for the support of the ministers for the year Ensuving
