At a Town meeting in Sudbury Legally warned May 21: 1733

The Town being met proceeded & chose L^d John Hayns Moderator Likewise it was put to vote for to see if y^e Town would Incourage y^e Reverend minister or ministers by giving them or either of them a further Gratuity and order it to be added to y^e next Rate made for their salary The Reverend M^r. Cook Less brings him under a necessity of further help and it passed in the Negative

Likewise said Town by a vote chose Daniel Goodenow & Ezra Graves a Committee for to amend and put into good Repair y^e Butments of y^e Great Bridge standing over Sudbury River at y^e Easterly End of the Long Caseway so as y^e said Butments may not be washed down or Carried away by floods as in times past and to bring in their Acompts of their Cost & charge as to y^e mending or Repairing said Butments to said Town at their next meeting for Debt and Credit there to be allowed & Paid therefor
