Constables ward Qualified as the Law Directs to meet at the West meeting House
in Said Town on Monday 29th Day of December next insuing the Date
here of at Ten of the Clock in the fore noon on Said Day then
and there to. So if the Town will Give to the Reverend Mr. William Gosh
Something in money to make up the Loss of His barn a greable to
a portion ofundry Inhabitants of Said Town
All so to so if the Town will Rais the Reverend Ministers Salary
of Said Town their Galleries or Give them a Grattuetz and
order it in to a Rate as the Town shall think fitt

Likewise to so if the Town will grant money for the support of the
Grammar School in Said Town. And for lighting & Reading Schools

All so to so if the Town will Grant further with a Grammar Schoolmaster as the
Town shall think fit

Likewise to Chuse a Trustee for the Last Bank In the Rooms and
to supply the Place in Said Trust of Mr. John Rice Doceast as
Directed by the Act of the Gen^l Court.

All so to Receive the Towns part of the Interest of the Last Bank
of their Trustees viz Cap^t Joshua Haynes & L^d John Haynes and to
pay Said Trustees for their past service in that affair

Likewise to so if the Town will incur the charge the turning of the
Centree Roode in Said Town by John Grouts where it is petitioned for
by Procuring of Land of L^d Samuel Graves John Grount and
Joseph Parmenter for Said Centree Roode and Order the selectmen to Lay
out Said Roode: All so to a Gree with Cap^t Daniel Elhabrook Mr. David Baldwin
and Ezra Graves or others to make a sufficient Roode over the Brook &
all the new Roode to be made good for sooms to pass in & kept in good Repair
for Twelve years for Twenty pounds - - And appoint a man or
men to Inform the Certs Comitte that they may make Report in favour
to Said Roode To prevent further charge
Or Order the old Roode to be made Good & kept in good Repair

And make Return of this order with
your Doings here in to the selectmen
or Town Clerk at time & Place.
