At a town meeting legally warned the town being met at time and place proceeded to Chuse Mr Jonathan Rice Representative for the town of Judbury:

Also at the town meeting the town by their votes Chose: Noah Clap moderator:

Like wise said town by a vote Granted thirty pounds for the support of the Grammar School in the town of Judbury

At the town meeting voted by the town that the Reverend Mr Minot shall have five pounds for his preaching three days at Judbury in Mr Loring Room he being lame and unable to preach:

The town by a vote ordered their assessors for to add it into the town Rate last Granted by said town:

A said town by a vote Granted forty shillings for to Clear the brush Round the meeting house on the west side of the River in the town

for to be Drawn out of the Trustees Due to the town for the last year from their Trustees: viz: Cap: Joshua Haynes and Linot John Haynes

And further the town by a vote: Chose Linot Haynes for to Clear said brush and ordered them for to Draw said forty shilling out of the Interest as aforesaid

At a second town meeting voted by the town: that their Representative prefer a petition to the General Court in the behalfs of the town for a school farm in sum of the unappropriated Lands

At a select mens meeting: voted and agreed: with Mr Saml Kindal: for to keep school in Judbury six months and to begin the Grammar school: November: 11: 1734: after the Rate of sixty pounds pr: year:
