To our Eldest Goodnow one of the Constables of Judbury
These are to order you to warn the freeholders and other inhabitants
of and belonging to the town of Judbury: in the South Constables
ward: and on the west side Judbury River: Qualified as the Law Directs
to meet at the west meeting House: in the town: on Thursday the
fourteenth Day of November Current: at one of the Clock afternoon
of Day: then and there: To see if the town will order the high way
lately laid out by a Jury Near to John Grants: to be made: agreeable
to the Courts order: or let it out to be made: and Grant money for
the same as occasion may require: Likewise to Raise money to pay
the Charges of laying out the same: amounting to Eleven pounds
and fourteen shillings: Likewise to Grant money to pay several
persons for the land taken from them to accommodate the afore
high way: Likewise to see if the town will Grant money for the support
of the school or schools in the town: and make Return of this order
with your Doing herein to the select men or town Clerk at time
and place above said fail not: By order of the select men

within mentioned Eldest Goodnow: Constable in Judbury

Judbury November: 14: 1734: At a town meeting legally
warned the town being met at time and place: proceeded to Chas.
Lins^t John Haynes moderator.

1. at said town meeting it being put to vote: whether the said town
will order the high way lately laid out by a jury Near to John Grants
to be made: agreeable to the Courts order: or let it out to be made:
and Grant money for the same as occasion may require: And it
passed in the Negative.
2. voted by said town for to Raise money for the payment of the
Charges of laying out of the high way: Eleven pounds and
fourteen shillings.
3. it was put to vote by the town: whether: said town would Grant
money to pay the several persons for the land taken from them to
accommodate the afore high way: And it passed in the Negative.
4. it was put to vote for to see if the town would Grant money for
the support of the schools in the town: this present year: and the town
by a vote Granted Thirty pounds: for the support of the school at
the school House: in the town: And twenty pounds: for and towards
schools in the out parts or Quarters of the town
And further the town by a vote ordered their assessors for to make
all the above Grants into a Rate with the ministers Rate now
to be made:
