

Middlesex To Mr Daniel Woodward one of the Constables for Judbury
in the County of Middlesex Greeting

Complaint being this Day made unto me the Subscriber one of his majesties
Justices of the peace within and for the County of Middlesex: by John Goodnow
and Nine other Inhabitants of said Judbury:

That whereas on the first Day of April last past: At a meeting of the Inhabitants
of the town of Judbury: by a vote Chose Ephraim Curtis Esq: Capt Daniel Easterbrooke
and Lieut John Hayns: To be a Committee: to sell or Dispose of the Two thirty Rods
high way or Land: Commonly so Called Lying in the New Grant

And that whereas Ten or more of the Qualified Inhabitants of the said Judbury upon
the fourth Day of November Instant: Express their Desire and Request in
writing: to the Select men of said Judbury: to insert in their next town meeting
as part of the work of the Day: to see if said town will Reconsider their former
vote in the Chose of the above sd Comtee: and Dismiss said Comtee: from proceeding
in that affairs

And that the said Select men upon the fourth Day of November Instant did
Refuse or unreasonable Deny the sd Request as to me appears:

And therefore humbly pray that a warrant may be Granted according to the Law
of the province for the Calling of a town meeting: viz: to see if said town will
proceed to Dismiss said Comtee as above sd:

These are therefore: In his majesties Warrant: to will and Require you the above sd
Daniel Woodward forth^{with} to warn and Give Notice to all the freemen and other
Inhabitants: living in the said Judbury: who are Qualified according to Law to vote in
town affairs: To meet at the next meeting House in the said Judbury: on the west side
of the Judbury River: on Monday the Eighteenth Day of November Instant at
Ten of the Clock in the fore noon

In order to see if said town will Reconsider their former vote and Dismiss said
Committee from proceeding in said affairs:

And make Return of this warrant with your Doing there in to the Select men
or town Clerk: of the said Judbury: before the time prefixed for the meeting: fail not
at your perill:

Eight year of his majesties Reign: Anno Domini: 1734
