For our Josiah willis one of the Constables in Judbury Greeting  
these are to order you to warn the freesholders and other inhabitants  
of and belonging to Judbury on the west side the River: and in the South  
Constables ward: Qualified as the Law Directes to vote in town affairs  
To meet at the East meeting house in D town on Monday the twentieth  
Day of April Next Ensuving the Date hereof: Ten of the Clock  
fore noon on D Day then and there: To bring in town Debt and Credit  
Likewise to see if the town will Give the Reverend ministers a Gratiuity  
the Insuving year: Also to see if the town will provide a Grammar School  
master for the year Insuving: and Grant money for the support of the  
School: Also to see if the town will Grant thirty pounds the remaining  
part of sixty pounds agreed for the year past with our present School master  
Mr Kindell: Also to see if the town will appoint persons to Take the Care  
of the meeting houses the year Insuving: also to Dig Graves as may be occasion  
Also to see if the town will vote that the Swine may Goe all Long the  
present year in D town:  
Likewise to see if the town will make Mr Heard a further Consideration for  
what he has Don in making of the New way by John Grants in Judbury  
Also to see if the town will order any thing further for the perfecting of D  
way: Likewise to see if the town will Discontinue part of the High way  
formerly laid out by the Select men of Judbury: that Goes over whals Bridge  
on the pine plain: to Linot Elisha Rices: to wit that part of D way within  
Jonathan Grants fence: and Give that land within D Grants fence to him  
the D Jonathan Grant in Satisfaction for what land was taken from him  
for the a Comadating of the New way last laid out by the Select men of  
a Crose part of D Grants Land  
Likewise to see if the town will Grant money to purchase a Bell: in answer  
to a petition preferred to the Select men by Linot Hayns and others: and  
Chuse a man or men to manage D affair: Also to see if the town will Doe  
any thing to Incourag the killing of Black birds and jays:  
And make Return of this order to the Select men at Time and place  
by order of the Select men of Judbury
