At a town meeting Legally warned: agreed with Mr Zachariah Heard: To make
the New high way by John Grouts: Two foot and a half higher than now it is
with Good stones and Gravel: with a Good and sufficient wall on each side: as
the other part hath been done: also to Rail it: sufficiently: with two Rails
on each side: with posts upon the tops of the wall: the posts to be Good white oak
to be a Cross the said Cartway: within Ten or Twelve foot on of an other
and to Take the Gravel for the way upon the North side of the Cart way
in the most convenient place for the Road: And to warrant it for the space of
five years from this Date: all said work to be done for Ten pounds of money
to the acceptance of the select men of the town: all said work to be Completed
by the last Day of July: Enjoining the Date here of
the above said agreement: Voted and Complied with by said town: and Mr Heard

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Voted by the town that the assessors make
the Twenty pounds and the ten pounds
last Granted into the town Rate last
Granted by the town April: 12: 1736
