Those are to Order you to warn all the Free-holders & other Inhabitants off & belonging to the Easterly Side of the River in Sudbury in the North Constables Ward qualified as the Law directs to Vote in Town Affairs to meet at the West Meeting house in S.^d Sudbury on Wednesday the Eleventh Day of April next at twelve a Clock at Noon.

1. To bring in Town Debt & Credit.
2. To See if the Town will grant y.^e Rev.^d Minister a Gratuity for the Present Year.
3. To See if the Town will Remove the Grammar School into the Several quarters of the Town as the Town shall agree upon when met, In Answer to a Petition of Several of the Inhabitants off S.^d Town.
4. To See if the Town will Join with Watertown, & other Towns in Building a Work House that Idle Persons may be Employed in Business therein.
5. To See if the Town will provide a Gram.^r Schoolmⁿ. for the ensuing Year.
