Town on Thursday the Seventeenth Day of May Currant at one of the Clock P.M. then & there to Elect & Depute one or more meet Person or Persons to Serve & Represent S^d. Town, at the Great & Gen^l. Court, or Assembly to be holden at the Court House in Boston upon Wednesday the 30th. Day of May Currant - Conformable to the Precept. &c.
