To m^r Josiah Parker one of the Constables of
Sudbury Greeting — These are to order you to
warn all the freeholders and other inhabitants
of and belonging to Sudbury in your ward Qualifie
as the Law Directs to Vote in town affairs to
meet at the west meetinghouse in the town on
Friday the twenty second day of May current at
Twelve o'clock at noon To day then and there to
elect and depute one or more Persons to Serve for
and Represent them in a Great and General
Court or Assembly appointed to Be Convened here
and kept for his Majesties Service at the Court house
in Boston on Wednesday the twenty seventh day of May
Current &c.

2 To s^e if y^e town will take care to Provide a Grammar
Schoolmaster for the year ensuing and to s^e if y^e
Town will appoint who shall Order where y^e School
shall Be kept y^e year ensuing

3 To s^e if y^e town will allow the select men of the town
to Draw money out of their Treasury for to Pay
m^r Jonathan Loring for the time he hath kept
School in the town and is not yet Payed for —

4 To s^e what meathords the town will farm into to
Prevent Inerachments on y^e Ministerial Lands &
meadow in the town

5 To s^e if the town vote that y^e Swine in the town Go at
Large y^e year ensuing

6 To s^e if y^e town will Satisfie m^r Joseph Maynard
and m^r Eben^r Puffer for a high way laid out through
their Lands

7 To s^e if the town order the Trustees of the late lone
money & that they settle and make up accounts
