ward qualified as the Law Directs to vote in town affairs
To meet at y^e West meetinghouse in S^d. town on Monday y^e
Eighteenth day of October Current at Ten o'clock from noon
Then and there

1. To Bring in town Debts and Credit
- 2 To See if y^e town will Grant their Poor and ministers a Gratuity
for y^e year ensuing including their fire wood
- 3 To See if y^e town will order the Assessors of S^d town to make
The Town and ministers Rates By the Last years Invoice
- 4 To See if y^e town will Provide a Grammar Schoolmaster
for y^e year ensuing as the Law Directs and to order in what
part of y^e town S^d school shall Be kept in S^d year and
Grant money for y^e same
- 5 To See if y^e town will do any thing to Prepare the house for a
Prat. Liver in or to Build a workhouse Near adjoining and
To Grant money as shall Be thought needfull for the same
and make due Return of this order and Doings Hereunto
