To Mr. Hopefull Bont one of the Constables of Sudbury &c
These are to Order you to Warn all the freeholder and other Inhabitants of and Belonging to Sudbury in your Ward Inalified as the Law Directs to Vote in town affair to Meet at y^e East Meeting house in Sudbury on Friday the thirteenth Day of June Current at two O'clock after Noon Then & there

1 To See if y^e Town will Chuse a Constable in and for y^e North Constables Ward on y^e East Side the River in said town for this present year there being a vacancy in said town By Reason of y^e Non Acceptance of y^e Person that was Chosen to do Office at y^e Last March Meeting in said Town

2 To See if y^e Town will Chuse a fourth and fully Impower them to Prefer a Petition to the General Court Praying that said Town of Sudbury may have another Hearing Before y^e Next General Sessions of y^e Peace in the County of Midd^x on y^e Road petitioned for By some of y^e Inhabitants of New and others leading through part of Sudbury By De. Jonathan Greed. M^r. John Cap. & M^r. Benjamin Eastbrook which affair hath been in agitation in said Sessions and Judgment hath been given in favour of said Petitioners &c and further Impower the Committee to affair at said Sessions & Sessions unto final Judgment and Due Return of this order & your doings thereon to the Selectmen at time and place above mentioned By order of y^e Selectmen Josiah Browne Town Clerk

Note The Return of y^e other three Constables orders for do meeting are as the Law Directs

Sudbury June 9th 1749 I have Warned y^e freeholders and other Inhabitants Inalified as y^e Law Directs to Meet at time and place as within mentioned Hopefull Bont one of y^e Constables of Sudbury

At a Meeting of y^e Inhabitants of Sudbury on y^e thirteenth day of June 1749 Equally Warned to Town By their Votes Chose Josiah Browne y^e Moderator Then to town By their Votes Chose Bezalael Moore Constable who appeared at do Meeting and the Oath Belonging to the office of a Constable being offered by a Justice of Peace But subbly & inly Refused to take said Oath notwithstanding the being by said Justice Required so to do
