

At said meeting the 6. Day of march 1749. a vote was cald to see if the Town will mend and Repair their high ways the Ensueing year by a Tax or Rate and it passed in the negative

The Town voted to Chuse a Committee and Impowered them to Examine and Look into the severall Grants of money as made by said Town for seven years last past and make Report to the Town of their proceedings in said affair as soon as may be the Committee are as followeth: Mr. Samuel Parvis Capt. Josiah Richardson & Mr. William Rice the said Comitte to a Compt with the severall Town Treasurers Respectively and make Report to said Town of what sums have been made and Granted how they have been appropriated how Discharged and what Remains as Ballance

March 1749. The Town Chose Ephraim Curtis Esqr & Capt. Josiah Richardson Agents for the Town of Sudbury to appear for them at the next Cort of Genl Sessions of the Peace. To prevent Charge coming on said Town by any Bill of Cost preferred to the Cort. By a Committee of the Town of Stow

at said meeting the Town Granted to Mr. Hopefull Bent and to Capt. Thomas Damon the money they owed the Town for which is to be tried at the next Cort of Common Pleas to be holden at Charlestown and the Leagual Cost Excepting fifteen shillings each as they abate of their first Demand and to be put in to the next fall Rate that shall be made to pay Town Debts. to be paid in old Tene money

Voted at said meeting to Discontinue so much of the high way a Gainst James Mofraons Land as the selectmen shall think fit. and sell the same and Give an a Compt of their proceedings to said Town

The Town at said meeting accepted of the way as laid out by the selectmen at the Request of Isaac Rice

The Town accepted of a high way Laid Begining at a stake and stones at Naticks Line said Road to be Two Rods wide & the mark ^{the} on the eutherly side and from said stake & stones to a stone wall of Mr. Brintnals so Running westerly to an other stake & stones & so to another stake & stones by Capt. Damons fence & so by said fence to the Town way Leading from L. Brintnals to Capt. Damons

Then the Town adjourned the meeting till fry Day 4th 9 Day of march Currant to the House of Mr. Isaac Baldwins Inholder in Sudbury to three of the Clock afternoon
