

- 3^{ly} To see if the Town will Discontinue the high ways in the Two miles Last Granted to the Town of Sudbury (also known by the name of the new Grant as is Petitioned for by sundry Inhabitants & free holders of said Town with Proper Testimonies as set forth in said Petition Baring Date April 4th 1750
4. To see if the Town will Discontinue three Rods of the High way that was Left Six Rods wide formerly by the Town of Sudbury at the head of the River meadow Lots on the west side of the River from the Gravel pit so far as to the Brook by Mr. Phineas Haynes the Three Rods to be Left where the selectmen shall judge most Convenient for the Publick Use and Chuse a Committee and fully Impower them to sell what the Town shall Discontinue and give a Lawfull Deed or Deeds in the Towns name the money to be applyed for the Towns Use and make Due Return of this Order to the selectmen at Time & Place above mentioned

The Petition

Sudbury April 4th 1750

To the selectmen of the Town of Sudbury. Gentlemen the Petition of us the Subscribers is that you will be pleased to insert an article in your next Town meeting you have for Publick business. To see if the Town will Discontinue the Two high ways Lyeing in the Two miles Last Granted to the Town of Sudbury (to wit) a high way thirty Rods in width running from the south side of said Town to the north side of said Town joining to the old Town Boundaries. all so the high way running from the south side of said Town to the north side of said Town running between the Two Ranges of Grant Lots being thirty Rods in width Excepting Somuch in each of the afore said high ways as the Towns Committee shall think fit. (to wit) Ephraim Luntis Thomas Damon & Jonathan Smith who were appointed by the Town of Sudbury to eject any person out of Possession that have got any of the afore said high ways into their possession without Leave from said Town and to sell the Rest and give Lawfull Deeds in the Towns name of all the Land they shall sell in both of the afore said high ways. said Committee are ordered to sell all the Land in both of the high ways But what they shall judge needfull to Leave still for high ways for the Towns Use &c all so to see if the Town will Discontinue a high way running throu the Two miles Last Granted the Town of Sudbury being thirty Rods in width. said Committee are to Leave four Rods in width all the way for the Towns Use for a high way and to sell the Rest as above Express. said four Rods in width to be Left where the afore said Committee shall judge most Convenient for the Towns Use. and to give Lawfull Deeds of the Rest in the Towns name &c.
