At a meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury By a Harroment from the 15th Day of this Instant October to the aforesaid 29. Day of October &c
Said Town Proceeded to finish the work of said meeting. And Granted as followeth

- To Jabez Puffer for Timber for to Build a Bridge a cross a flow &c $5 = 5 = 4$
- To Jabez Puffer for Perambulating the Town Bounds with flow $0 = 2 = 0$
- To Deaⁿ. Jonathan Rice for Repairing & mending the high way by his Route on
marlborough Road for Two years past. $0 = 3 = 4$ a year $0 = 6 = 8$
- To Joseph Queleth for Damages by means of a Road going through his Land $5 = 17 = 4$
- To John Clap for Damages by means of a Road going through his Land $10 = 13 = 4$
- To Benjamin Estabrook for Damages by means of a Road going through his Land $16 = 5 = 4$
- To Pay the Sheriff and Jurors for Estimating the Damages on the Road by
Mr. Estabrook John Clap & Joseph Queleth &c $10 = 1 = 7$
- The Town Granted for Continging Charges: to Lye in the Town Treasurers hand
till Drawn out by the selectmen of Sudbury when there may be occasion $4 = 1 = 5$ 2
- To Ephraim Puffer for Damages he sustained by Reason of a high way through his Land $0 = 13 = 4$
- To Elias Moore for provisions he provided for Pangasons wife by order of y^e selectmen $0 = 5 = 8$
- To Daniel Goodenow for one Journey to Charlestown to prevent an Execution on Joyner's Case $0 = 5 = 0$
- To Sederiah Allen for 34. feet of plank laid on y^e Bridge at Lt. Rices $0 = 4 = 0$
- To Deaⁿ. Jonathan Rice for Damage by Reason of a Road through his Land &c $2 = 0 = 0$
- To Isaac Rice for Damage by Reason of a Road taking a piece of his Land $0 = 5 = 0$
- To Henry Looker for Damages by Reason of a Road going through his Land $8 = 0 = 0$
- Granted twenty six pounds Two shillings & six pence to be Drawn out of the treasury

- The Town by a vote ordered the selectmen to provide a Grammar school for y^e Town y^e year ensuing
- To the support of a Grammar school for the Tⁿ Town the year ensuing $37 = 6 = 8$
- To the support of Reading & wrighting schools in said Town the year ensuing $27 = 0 = 0$
- To the support of Reading & wrighting schools shall be kept in the Two Towns
Voted & ordered that the Grammar school shall be kept in the Two Towns
school houses By each of the Meeting Houses in said Town the year ensuing
Voted and ordered by the Town that the selectmen shall order where the Reading
and wrighting schools shall be kept the year ensuing
- Granted for to pay the Town Treasurer and School for their service the ensuing year

- The Town Granted five pounds to Enable the Towns Comitte (viz) Ephraim Puffer Jonathan
Smith & Capt. Thomas Damon to Eject any person or persons out of Possession that have
Got any of the thirty Rod high ways in to their possession with out the Towns Leave &c $5 = 0 = 0$
- The Town Granted to Build the Town Bridge to be Drawn out by the selectmen
if it coms to so much $13 = 6 = 8$
- The Town By a vote or votes chose a Comitte to
Build the Town Bridge or Git it Done in the best and cheapest manner
And chose for their Comitte En. Samuel Dakin Mr. John Woodward & Elijah Smith
for their Comitte
- The Town By a vote Gave Leave to Mr. Josiah Willis to hang a Gate or cross the highway
that Goes from Benjamin Parmentors Lot to west medow so that it becoms a Bridge way
- The Town by a vote chose Two Agents to appear at the next Crt. of Gen. Sessions of
the peace to be holden at Charlestown to prevent the Charge of the Jury that Laid out the
County Road from Natick to Joseph Beals &c to the Charge of the Comitte on the Road
from Tow through part of Sudbury - Coming on the Town of Sudbury
- And chose Capt. Josiah Richardson & Ephraim Curtis for their Agents
- The Town by a vote Gave to the Wid^o. Elizabeth King the Peace of Land she
Bought of the Towns Comitte (viz) Capt. David Baldwin & Mr. Joseph Livermore
- The Town by a vote ordered their Comitte (viz) Capt. David Baldwin & Mr. Joseph Livermore
to Deliver the money they Received for land they sold for the Town &c To the
