At a Town meeting Leaguallly warned the Town being met at Time & place proceeded to the work of the Day and chose Mr. Samuel Larris. their Representative At. said meeting the Town proceeded and chose Ephraim Curtis. Dep. Moderator

1. The Question was put to see if the Town will accept the List of Jurours as put in to the Box by the selectmen. and Exhibited to the Town: And it passed in the Affirmative
2. It was put to vote to see if the swine in said Town shall goe at Large the year Ensueing and it passed in the Affirmative
3. The Question was put to see if the Town will Repair their Highways the Currant year by a Rate or Tax. and it passed in the Affirmative and accordingly voted and Granted the sum of forty pounds. and by a vote ordered the Assessors to assess the Town for the same by the same Rule they made the Last Assessment or Tax on of said Town. The Town voted Eight hours shall be accounted for a Days work — and Voted Two shillings shall be a Days wages for a man & so in proportion to an hour — and all so voted that one shilling be allowed for a good Yoke of Oxen a Day — and all so voted that three pence be allowed for a Good Cart a Day in working at the highways &c — further voted that the Surveyors give notice to the inhabitants of the Respective wards that they may have opportunity to work oute their Rate or Tax — and all so voted that the Surveyors give a Certificate to the Town Treasurer what each man has worked out. and what sum he is Entitled to
