Then the Town by a Vote adjourned their Meeting to Wednesday the Seventh Day of March Current to meet at the same place at four of y^e Clock afternoon to finish the work of S^d Meeting &c.

At a Town Meeting in Sudbury on March y^e Seventh 1753. by Adjournment from March y^e 3th 1753. In Order to finish the work Set forth in the Warning of S^d Meeting. The Town being met at time & place proceeded to the work of the Day &c.

2^{ly} At S^d Meeting the Question was put whether Horses Should go at large in any part of S^d Town without fetters any part of y^e time from the first of April to the last of November y^e Year ensuing. And it passed in the Negative.

3. The Question was put, whether the Sheep Should go at large in S^d Town any part of the Time between the fifteenth day of March next, & y^e first of May next. And it passed in the Negative.

4. To See if the Town will accept of a Town Way laid out by y^e Selectmen of Sudbury from Pelotiah Deans North East Corner into y^e Town Way leading from the Training field by Ephraim Curtis's Esq^r. by St. Rices to Weston as Set forth in the Minits of S^d Way. And the Town Accepted of S^d Way as the Selectmen had laid it out, that it may be recorded.

5^{ly} Also a Town Way from Mr. Jonathan Griffyn's Corner running South westerly into the Way by Mr. Eliab Moors North Corner, formerly Mr. John Adams as Set forth in the Minits of S^d Way. And it passed in the Affirmative that so it may be recorded.

6^{ly} To See if the Town will mend their high Ways by a Rate the Year ensuing as they did the Year past, and Appoint the Surveyors to be Collectors of S^d Rate, or Tax, and grant Money for the same, and order any thing further with respect to the mending their high Ways, as the Town shall think best when met. The Town Voted to mend their high Ways by a Rate the Year ensuing as they did the Year past. (2^{ly}) Voted that the Surveyors Shall be Collectors of S^d Rate. (3^{ly}) Voted the Sum of Eighty Pounds to repair their high Ways y^e Year ensuing. It was Voted that Assessors Should forthwith make S^d rate. - It was Voted by S^d Town that the price of a Days work to be two Shillings reckoning eight hours to the day. - And the price of Oxen & Cart Shouts be as it was y^e last Year. It was Voted that there Should be four Surveyors in S^d Town. and that the Inhabitants of S^d Town Should have Liberty to pay their rate for repairing their High Ways, in Labour.
